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## Introduction

We have now good compilations of evidence in prevention, and a set of minimal standards.

But we have only scarce knowledge about how the evidence in prevention can be applied in prevention policy and from there into prevention practice.

Important determinants - beyond political will and competence - seem to be

- how prevention policies are delivered in organisational terms
- how prevention is funded
- whether quality criteria are linked to funding
- whether the different policy sectors (education, health, youth, criminal justice) properly cooperate
- whether research centres are involved in evaluation and development
- how much policy makers and professionals know about effective principles
- whether effective programmes are available

## Objectives of the meeting:

- to discuss the different experiences in European countries and regions of responding to the challenges above under different administrative and cultural conditions.
- to agree on a set of variables (or dimensions) by which prevention systems could be characterised (for example for the [prevention profiles](#)).
- to produce a short technical paper and/or similar information on the EMCDDA web site informing about essential, important and accessorial ingredients in building prevention systems that cover - with quality - all domains of behavioural influence, from environmental to indicated prevention.
